QUALIFICATIONS

Tertiary qualifications in either:

- Environmental Science
- Biological Sciences
- Earth Sciences
- Environmental Engineering, or
- Natural Resource Management related spheres.

Honours or post-graduate studies will be considered favourably, but is not essential.

A current Certificate of Competency in DELWP's *Vegetation Quality Assessment (VQA / Habitat Hectare)* methodology under the *Guidelines for removal, destruction or lopping of native vegetation* (the Guidelines) is highly desirable, or must be achievable in the near future.

EXPERIENCE and KEY ATTRIBUTES

Minimum 5 years' employment is required in environmental assessment, planning or natural resource management related spheres, either in Government or private practice. Previous consulting experience working in a client-focused environment is highly desirable.

Ecological assessment skills with field-based experience and reporting on vegetation assessments in accordance with DELWP's *Guidelines for removal, destruction or lopping of native vegetation* is required, preferably including a *Vegetation Quality Assessment (VQA)* Certificate of Competency.

A sound knowledge of, and past experience working with key environmental planning and natural resource management strategies/documents relevant to land use planning in Victoria is required. Must possess knowledge of State and Commonwealth environmental policy/legislation relevant to natural resource management.

Must have high level written and verbal skills. Proven past experience in preparing detailed assessment reports, management plans and related documents is essential, including the capacity to communicate outcomes to clients.

Must possess a high capacity for self-motivation and be able to apply environmental knowledge to a variety of planning and environmental assessment tasks. Excellent time management skills and the ability to work largely independent of supervision are essential.

Advanced word processor and computer skills are essential, including experience with ESRI Arc GIS (or similar) spatial mapping and GPS software.

Capacity to work remotely in physically challenging terrain, and at times for extended periods (up to 5 days), potentially including overnight camping.

Existing four wheel drive experience is highly desirable.

First Aid skills will be required, with additional on-job training provided.

Demonstrated past experience in one or more of the following fields will be seen as advantageous, although the position offers considerable flexibility and the opportunity, over time, to ensure both the Applicant's aspirations and the job requirements can be fulfilled.

- Flora and Fauna surveys and assessments.

- Botanical identification skills, including targeted species survey.
- Preparation of flora and fauna assessment reports.
- Experience in pest plant and animal survey, impact assessment, control and development of management strategies.
- Flora surveys in accordance with: the *Native Vegetation Guidelines*; Index of Stream Condition; or Index of Wetland Condition methods; transects; quadrats etc.
- Preparation of supporting documentation for environmental statutory approvals, including for planning scheme (Council) permit applications, Crown land works approval, or under the Commonwealth EPBC Act.
- Preparation of works plans and specifications in sensitive environments, including rehabilitation / revegetation specifications.
- Research for, and preparation of, Crown land conservation management plans, such as Coastal / Foreshore management plans, Riparian/Wetland management plans, Wildlife Reserve or National Park management plans.
- Research for, and preparation of, strategic environmental or natural resource management planning documents, such as catchment management strategies, pest plant strategies, river management/health strategies, or water quality management plans etc.
- Preparation of soil & water erosion management plans, and rehabilitation / revegetation plans for construction sites.
- Environmental monitoring (eg water quality).
- Environmental compliance auditing.
